Dhat syndrome (Sanskrit: दहतु दोष, IAST: Dhātu doṣa) is a condition found in the cultures of the Indian subcontinent (including Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, Nepal, and Sri Lanka) in which male patients report that they suffer from premature ejaculation or impotence, and believe that they are passing semen in their urine. The condition has no known organic cause. This appendix, which is a collection of clinical practice guidelines and related materials, has three main purposes.
